Dear Chairman Pignatelli and Chairwoman Gobi:

We write to you today concerning the welfare of elephants in traveling shows and ask that you report bill H.418, An Act relative to the use of elephants in traveling animal acts, favorably.

The inhumane treatment of these animals warrants our moral concern. Elephants are remarkable animals renowned for their memory and intelligence. To subject these animals to a miserable life on the road, where they are robbed of the ability to express their most basic and natural behavior is cruel and preventable.

Elephants in traveling shows are chained, confined to small spaces, shocked with electric prods, hit and stabbed with bullhooks, and kept in socially-deprived conditions to learn circus tricks, which in and of themselves cause "a great deal of stress on the muscles and joints of these very large mammals." Immobilizing these animals that are meant to roam the vast savannah to small pens where they have to stand in their own excrement results in problems such as degenerative joint disease and foot disorders- which are the leading causes of euthanasia in captive elephants-as well as urine burns, rotting and cracked foot pads, and cracked and infected nails.

Not only do elephants suffer physically as a result of negative reinforcement training, they suffer immense long-term psychological trauma and stress as well. It bears repeating that the fear of punishment is the sole reason elephants perform acts for humans that would be considered brutally outlandish in their natural environment. Even though circuses are moderately regulated by the federal Animal Welfare Act, there is no agency that monitors training sessions when the most violent abuses occur. Often times, no one is allowed in training areas, which are usually fenced off and blocked from public view. Watching elephants perform unnatural tricks does not teach our children respect or appreciation for animals, nor does it teach children how elephants

behave naturally in the wild. Instead, it teaches our children that it is acceptable to exploit and mistreat animals for amusement and profit.

Public opinion is already shifting on the captivity of wild animals for entertainment. In March, 2016, Feld Entertainment, the parent company of Ringling Bros., by far the largest operator in this space, first announced they would not be using elephants in their circuses. In January, 2017 they followed up with an announcement of the complete closure of the circus. This decision was both economic and a reflection of changing attitudes. This is great news for the wild animals in their shows but there are still several smaller circuses performing in Massachusetts with elephants that need our help.

Even if most circuses did not treat elephants with such cruelty, elephants belong in environments that nurture their natural behavior and allow them to engage in their complex social networks, and circuses are certainly not such environments.
